



Try out this quick quiz to identify your child's learning type:

Q1: A tricky word appears! What do you do when you struggle with spelling?

1. Write it down to see if it looks right
2. Spell it out loud to hear if it sounds right
3. Look it up in the dictionary or online
4. Trace the letters in the air with your finger to make sense of it

Q2: What do you think of when you see the word 'puppy'?

1. Imagine a cute puppy in detail (color, type, clothes) in your head
2. Immediately remember the sound of a puppy barking
3. Remember a story about a puppy you read recently
4. Want to pet one right away

Q3: Your teacher announced a surprise test tomorrow! How do you plan to study?

1. Make quick flashcards to help you remember

2. Ask your sibling or parents to take a live quiz so you can rehearse your answers

3. Go through the copious notes you prepared during class

4. Make a quick game out of the learning material to learn

Q4: You just got your hands on the new game that's trending. What do you do first?

1. Check to see if there's an explainer video or a guided tutorial to help you out

2. Ask someone to demo it so you can learn

3. Read the manual thoroughly before trying it out

4. Figure it out on your own

Q5: Someone just played your favorite song. What do you do?

1. Find yourself replaying the song's video in your head as you hear it

2. You can't help but sing along

3. You know the lyrics inside out!

4. It's time to dance!

KEY:

Mostly **1s**: Visual learner 

Mostly **2s**: Auditory learner 

Mostly **3s**: Verbal learner 

Mostly **4s**: Kinesthetic learner 

Remember, learning is an individualized process and varies from child to child. Use these learning styles to guide your child's learning journey, but always let them explore (or stumble upon) their own ways to thrive!
